DISTRICT GOAL

Carrizo Springs Independent School District will provide school leadership with useful information that will assist our staff in creating a positive education experience for students in Students with active duty Military Connection parent or guardian. The district will provide guidance to district staff to the identification process and services and supports to provide Students with who identify as Military Connected. This process will assist giving students a positive educational experience and prevent a lapse of education to that population.

Carrizo Springs CSCISD has developed systems of identification, monitoring and resource availability for Military connection in accordance with the Every Students Succeeds Act (ESSA), 2015 - Requires all public schools to collect data on active-duty military school age children K-12th; also, known as the military student identifier.

DISTRICT MILITARY CONNECTION REPRESENTATIVE

School Liaisons can provide training and support to LEAs impacted by military installations. TEA encourages coordination with School Liaisons to help provide robust services for military-connected studentS.

Liaison Duties

- Facilitate the enrollment in or transfer to a public or open-enrollment charter school of any child in the district .
- Advocate for the needs of students with Military Connection.

- Coordinate with various school personnel and departments to ensure the required supports, practices, and best-practice strategies for serving students with military connection are implemented within LEAs.
- May coordinate with the Title I director, transportation director, McKinney-Vento Homeless liaison, dropout prevention/at-risk coordinator, special education staff, and other federal program staff.

COMMUNICATION CHANNELS

Establish roles and responsibilities of participants in collaborations meetings.

- Campus Registration clerks will review Military Connection forms during registration.
- Forms will be forwarded to Federal Programs for verification.
- 3. A review of grades and attendance will be completed every 3rd and 6th weeks to determine needed intervention.
- 4. Curriculum Specialist will assist Liaison with reviewing grades and attendance, work on sharing spreadsheets with campus teachers.
- 5. Military Connections Students Homeroom Teacher will be informed and will provide tutoring if needed or offer recommendations for assistance.
- 6.. Continued monitoring of students will occur throughout the school and year and Summer School recommendations will be reviewed as needed.
